There are many different types of weather.






Sometimes the weather is sunny and the sky is clear.

We might not know how long we are going to be gone.






My family will tell me when it is safe for us to go back home.


When the hurricane is over I might see damage around our neighborhood.

We may not have power or water for a few days.




We may have to fix things that were damaged.

We can read books, play games, draw pictures, make-up stories, and do other fun things while we are staying safe.








My family will help me along the way.
